Hiring Hotspots

London emerges as a common hiring location (many firms' European HQ), followed by Amsterdam, Paris, Berlin, Dublin, and Madrid.

Several companies use **regional hubs** to cover nearby markets.

E.G.

- Dublin (EMEA) Stripe & PayPal
- Warsaw (Eastern Europe) Adyen
- Barcelona (Southern Europe) -Checkout.com

Language & A Localization



A clear trend is the demand for multilingual talent.

All companies require local language skills for roles targeting non-English markets.

E.G.

- Stripe and PayPal seek German/French/Italian speakers in Ireland;
- Adyen and Mollie require Eastern European and Nordic languages;
- Worldline and Nexi hire locals in each country (French in France, Slovak in Slovakia, etc.)

Remote VS In-Office

Hybrid work is the norm.

E.G.

- 3 days in-office: Airwallex
- ~50% in-office: PayPal EMEA
- Occasional home office: Nexi/Nets
- Fully remote (role-dependent):
 - Stripe (remote in-country)
 - Checkout.com (remote but linked to a base office)

Overall, **flexibility** is a selling point, but **proximity** to clients and teams keeps offices important.

Seniority & Growth &

Hiring ranges from entry-level to leadership, but there's a tilt toward mid-career professionals in sales.

Many roles require **2–5+ years of experience** in fintech or payments sales, while companies also invest in junior talent pipelines.

E.G.

- SDR/BDR roles Checkout, Stripe, Airwallex, GoCardless
- Graduate programs Nexi's Graduate Program
- Internships Mollie's marketing intern in Paris

This mix suggests a need for both immediate expertise and long-term talent development in commercial teams.
